"Craft House Magic" is almost complete



A few notes and reminders:

- ✓ You can pay your cottage fees in the office or by sending in your check ASAP. The fees were due on June 8, 2019. PLEASE NOTE We now are accepting credit card payments. There will be a 5% service fee on ALL credit card purchases. (Cottage fees, lodge fees, etc.)
- ✓ There are "background check" forms in the office. Please fill one out if you participate in any activities with the campers. There is a \$6 fee associated with this, so please be ready to pay that as well. Also, please return the MEDIA RELEASE form that was included in your reservation packet.
- ✓ Did you read through the Camp Rules and Guidelines that were included in your reservation packet? If you need to read the guidelines and do not have a copy, please check with the office.
- ✓ PARKING Please be respectful of the parking situation. If you have visitors, let the office know and direct them to park in unmarked spots. Also, make sure there is an opening in and out of the upper lot.
 - PLEASE NO PARKING IN FRONT OF DUMPSTERS!
 - o PLEASE NO PARKING IN THE GWC UPPER LOT! (the old work shed area)
 - o Families who have more than one car at camp need to consolidate and park additional vehicles elsewhere. Check with the office if you have questions.
- ✓ VISITORS (per the Camp Rules) If the cottager or family is not going to be present and intends to extend their cottage for use by others, they must inform the Camp Office during the regular season. Visitors must register in the office during the season upon arrival to camp. No off-season use is allowed without the presence of the cottager or notification to the Executive Committee. Use of the cottage by the visitor is limited to less than 4 consecutive nights without approval by the Executive Committee



Safety is our priority



At the waterfront - Our head lifeguard Maya (You will read more about her in the next Barr-O-Meter) is in charge of our waterfront. For 1-10 swimmers, there needs to be one aquatic observer in addition to the lifeguard. From 11-20 there need to be two observers in addition to the lifeguard. Please help out by wearing the yellow vest to assist with waterfront safety.

Around camp - AED's in camp are here for your safety. There is one at the upper hill restrooms and one near the office. It will walk you through how to use it with audio instructions.

First Aid certified staff include all counselors, Macayla, Cindy, Bill, Kim, and Bridget.

ALICE (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) has provided our staff with preparation and a plan on how to more proactively handle the threat of an aggressive intruder or active shooter event.



Recycling news from Williams Bay

The Village will collect recyclables at the curbside along with your refuse on the day assigned to you. Monday is the collection day for the east side of town and Tuesday- the west side. All recyclables can be co-mingled in the recycling bin, but care should be taken to remove rings and rinse containers out.



Items to recycle include:

- Any plastic with an @ symbol
- All glass containers regardless of their color
- Metal containers: aluminum, bi-metal and steel
- Newspapers and magazines
- Office paper
- Corrugated cardboard
- Waste oil placed in a non-returnable, sealed container

Recycling Materials & Preparation

The following guidelines should be used when preparing your recyclables for collection:

Mixed Paper:

- newspapers
- magazines
- catalogs
- phone books
- file folders
- notebooks
- construction paper
- boxboard (cereal, chip, cake and cookie boxes)
- and junk mail

Be sure to remove any plastic or cellophane inserts that may be in cereal boxes, etc. All mixed paper should be placed in a separate brown paper grocery bag. The bags are also recycled.

Corrugated Cardboard:

- Remove liners
- No wax or plastic coated cardboard
- Collapse boxes and put under your 18-gallon recycling bin

Aluminum & Metal Can, Glass Bottles & Plastic

- Remove all tops and rinse clean
- Place loose in your 18-gallon recycling bin.

We recycle all plastic with a recycle symbol. (Except oil bottles and Styrofoam.)
