
Have you seen the new covers on the benches in the Candy Store and the Game Room?

2018 SANTA CAUSE IS COMING!!

Once again this successful event will be raising money for our camp. Look for raffle tickets to be available to sell before the end of summer. The newest addition to the event is the Lakeshore Estate Resale shop in Williams Bay.

From the Lake Geneva Regional News on March 14, 2018

Business is under way at the Lakeshore Estate Resale Shop, an enterprise supporting nonprofits at 80 N. Walworth St. Some of the items included a small drop-down writing table, bar stools, an African shield, and a chair with a back that flips up and turns it into a table. Each item was marked with a particular tag that indicated which charity would benefit from its sale. Nancy Waspi, who helps run the store on a voluntary basis, said the store will be open on Saturdays and Sundays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Waspi said the store had a cold opening in early March and seemed to generate some local interest. Waspi, director of the Santa Cause charities, said charitable organizations look for ways to generate income year-round, rather than just during special events. Some of the older charities have established donors, she said. But the smaller charities don't have that advantage. The business is owned by Community Causes, LLC. It is operating the resale shop in rented space formerly occupied by the Bragii Coffee House & Wine Bar.

Geneva Lake Alliance, a group of local charities, has joined with Community Causes in operating the new business venture. Members of the alliance include local charities. The store gives space to charities looking for a place to convert donated items into revenue. That includes members of the Santa Cause, a group of 13 nonprofit charities and charity groups that benefit from activities associated with Gage Marine in Williams Bay. The new shop offers free pickup of donations and delivery of purchased items. Waspi said she is hoping to get volunteers from participating charities and civic groups to help.



Just a reminder about some of our camp rules

Here are a few reminders about our camp rules.

- No alcoholic beverages are allowed outside your cottage once camp season opens. Alcoholic beverages are also prohibited in any camp buildings or on the grounds.
- Curfew and quiet hours are from 10: 30 PM until 8:00 AM. Children under 21 must be supervised after 10:30 PM.
- All grills whether charcoal or gas must be a minimum of 10 feet from any building. Those on a deck must have a fire-resistant grill pad and all grills must have a fire extinguisher outside within 10 feet of the grill. Grills are not to be left unattended at any time. Please use consideration when placing the grill as to avoid smoke, etc. from going into neighboring cottages.
- All cottagers must notify the Camp Office if there are guests staying in their cottage and it is their responsibility to apprise the guests of the camp rules.
- No firearms or weapons allowed.
 - PLEASE NO PARKING IN THE GWC UPPER LOT!

(That is the one where they tore down the work shed.)

Swimming

- All youth (up to 16 years old) swimmers must pass a swim test annually administered by our certified lifeguard
- The lifeguards have total authority of the lakefront while on duty and everyone must respect that authority
- No smoking or fishing during swimming hours
- No glass on the pier at any time
- No swimming under the pier or on the east (George William College) side of the pier without life guard consent.
- No diving in shallow area, diving is only allowed off the diving board and buoy side of pier
- No running, pushing, rough housing on the pier
- No shouting, loud noises or loud music on the pier
